



Number of Clients receiving services across all programs by fiscal year




Types of Direct Services Received by Clients – all victimization types

CV staff support clients through various systems and provides advocacy in conjunction with other services. Therefore, Individual Advocacy reflects as an extremely frequent service.








OTHER CRIMES CLIENTS BY AGE


OTHER CRIMES CLIENTS BY GENDER




OTHER CRIMES CLIENTS BY ETHNICITY



The term "Other Crimes" refers to victimizations not related to domestic violence or sexual assault. Other Crimes include (but are not limited to) Homicide, Physical Assaults, Robbery, Burglary, Elder Abuse, Vandalism, DUI. Of note within this chart – there are a higher number of elderly (over age 60) clients in the "Other Crimes" victimization category (10%) than are in the Sexual Assault (2%) or Domestic Violence (5%) categories.




SEXUAL ASSAULT CLIENTS BY ETHNICITY




The term "Sexual Assault" refers to sexually-based offenses. Of note within this chart – there are a higher number of child (age 0-17) clients in the "Sexual Assault" victimization category (61%) than in the Other Crimes (16%) or Domestic Violence (7%) categories.

The term "Domestic Violence" refers to victimizations related to Intimate Partner Violence as well as Familial Violence. Of note within this chart – there are a higher number of female clients in the "Domestic Violence" victimization category (87%) than in the categories of Sexual Assault (80%) and Other Crimes (72%).
